Pick up day for both trash and recycling is TUESDAY. You may leave your toters out on the curb on Monday evening.

General Info:

- Place toters with opening facing the road and far enough apart for automatic truck arms to lift each toter (this does not apply to those residents with backdoor service).
- Place ALL waste inside toters. Please try not to leave extra bags outside toter.
- Please do not put out toters before Monday evening and bring in by Tuesday evening.
- Please store toters out of street view.
- Two bulk pickups, free to residents, will still take place in the spring and fall.
- 10 bags of yard waste are allowed at each pickup. Bundled branches of no longer than 3 feet in length are also allowed. Yard waste that you choose to put in a toter goes in TRASH toter, not recycle toter.

YOUR RECYCLE TOTER:

- Leave recycled items in toter loose and clean, not packed together or bundled
- For smaller households it's not necessary to bring your recycle toter out every week if you don't need to. Since the items inside are clean, there will be no smell!

WHAT GOES IN AND WHAT STAYS OUT?

METALS - all rinsed and cleaned

YES TO: aluminum cans, foil, bakeware

Steel and tin cans

PAPER AND CARDBOARD – all clean and void of food waste

YES TO: Corrugated cardboard

Magazines, catalogues, office paper newspaper, junk mail, phone books

Flattened cardboard and paperboard boxes

Paper cardboard beverage boxes

Brown paper bags

NO TO: Pizza boxes with grease

Tissues, paper towels or other paper that have been in contact with food

GLASS – All rinsed and clean

YES TO: All colors

NO TO: Pyrex glassware

Ceramics and stoneware

Crystal glassware

Mirrors

Window Glass

Any type of light bulb

PLASTICS – All rinsed and clean

YES TO: Bottles and jugs, lids removed and put into trash

NO TO: Plastic bags

Plastic wrap/bubble wrap

Plastic wrap from paper towels, tp, etc.

Any plastic that will get caught in recycling machines

NO: Yard waste, food waste, any type of battery, electronics, computers, TV's, garden hoses, Christmas lights, extension cords
